

## **13th Street Corridor Improvement Plan**

### **Community Outreach Summary**

September 2025

This Engagement Summary outlines the outreach completed to date for the 13th Street Corridor and introduces upcoming opportunities for continued engagement. From early events, activities, and stakeholder interviews to the next phase of popups, meetings, and continued public surveys, the process is designed to keep building momentum and invite the community to stay engaged as planning and design move forward.



- 68 Total Survey Responses Over 75% of respondents identified as residents

  - Q10: How would you describe the 13th Street Corridor? Use a few keywords that you feel characterize the place.





#### **Key Takeaways:**

A majority of respondents see <u>traffic</u> and <u>safety</u> as major challenges in the corridor. The "<u>small town</u>" feel of Imperial Beach neighborhoods is cited as a major positive quality of the area. Many would like to see <u>street trees</u>, <u>street cleaning</u>, <u>landscape maintenance</u> and <u>lighting</u> as top improvements for the area. <u>Mixed-use</u> is a popular land use desired for the area. These responses match comments received in one-on-one interviews with stakeholders.


